

# Study regulations Master Neurosciences

## Validation of teaching units (TU)

A TU is acquired (or credited) if the final average is equal to or higher than 10 out of 20, taking into account the coefficients of the different tests of the TU.

Consequently, a TU whose average is less than 10 out of 20 is not acquired. However, a TU can be validated by compensation within a semester (except eliminatory mark).

For all tracks but Neurasmus, 1st and 2nd years, there is an eliminatory threshold for any mark lower than 8/20.

For the "Neurasmus" track, 1st and 2nd years, the threshold is reached for any mark below 10/20 in accordance with the obligations of the consortium to which this course is attached.

If an eliminatory mark is obtained in the 1st session for a TU, it must be retaken in the 2nd session.

#### Validation of semesters

The 1st year semesters can be obtained by compensation if the average between the different units of the semester, affected by their coefficient, is equal to or higher than 10/20 and if the student has not had any eliminatory mark.

The 2nd year semesters can be obtained by compensation if, in addition to the conditions applicable to the 1st year semesters, the average of the 3 optional units is at least equal to 10/20.

#### **Second session**

In order to contribute to the acquisition of knowledge and skills provided by the UE and to favour the success of the students, a second session is set up.

The rules are as follows:

- 1. In the absence of validation of the semester, any TU not acquired at the first session must be retaken at the second session.
- 2. Any TU acquired in the first session (except by compensation) is definitively acquired and cannot be retaken in the second session.

### **Obtaining the Master's degree**

The Master's degree is obtained after validation of each semester. There is no compensation between semesters. The Master's grade is calculated by taking into account the grades obtained for each semester. The Master's degree is obtained after 120 credits have been acquired.

## **Special conditions**

Attendance at the TU exams is compulsory, otherwise the student is considered absent and will be postponed or compensated.

Access to the second year of the Master's programme requires the validation of the two semesters of the first year, i.e. the acquisition of 60 credits.

Access to the second year of the Master's programme requires the student to have found a research internship. A list of internships is offered to the student but it is the student's responsibility to find the internship.
